Visit the WET Science Center in April

LOTT Clean Water Alliance (LOTT) is the regional wastewater utility for the cities of Lacey, Olympia and Tumwater in Thurston County, Washington. At the heart of LOTT's education and outreach program is the WET Science Center. WET stands for Water, Education and Technology. The center offers various programs to educate the community about water and the environment. In April, community members will learn about jellyfish, nearshore habitats, and microbes and can attend a planetarium show.

"We are excited to have Seattle's Museum of Flight return with their fantastic planetarium show on April 5," said Siri Nelson, LOTT's education program manager. "Shows will be available throughout the day, but space will be limited, and we recommend coming early to grab a spot."

In addition to the Museum of Flight, event participants will hear from LOTT's environmental educators and the Puget Sound Estuarium. Programming includes hands-on activities and crafts. No live animals will be attending these events.

The WET Science Center is open Monday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. It is free to visit and all are welcome to participate in events or programs. Free parking is available in the visitor lot, west of the WET Science Center. There is also metered street parking, which is free on weekends.
